The current 37 plus square mile Municipality of Murrysville has long been a place of human habitation and conflict. The area had important crossroads of Native American paths. Later roads and turnpikes followed those trails. The presentation will discuss some of the events that took place in the mid to late 18th century along Raystown path (known as Forbes Road) during the French and Indian War.

The presenter, Mr. Carl Patty Jr., is a life-long resident of Murrysville whose ancestors have lived here since the building of Forbes Road in 1758. Carl has had an avid interest in history since his student days at the University of Pittsburgh where he majored in anthropology and biology and studied Native American culture. While in college, he began participating as a French and Indian war re-enactor and later as an interpreter at historical sites. He has participated in many school events and with the Murrysville Historical Preservation Society of which he is currently president. For over 60 years, Mr. Patty has spoken with longtime residents from old local families to learn of their history. In addition, he has researched deeds and historical writings pertaining to western Pennsylvania and Ohio. Based on his findings, he has written historical articles for local newspapers.

December's meeting is also a kickoff to the holiday season, so festive cookies, coffee and tea will be served.


Tree of Life Synagogue
