For the past 25 years, radiologist Dr. Robert Brown has studied the health of over 300,000 patients. X-rays, CT scans, ultrasound studies, and MRI scans have shown him the assorted effects that disease and injury can have on human health. Over this time, he has accumulated vast experience with how toxins affect our lives: from the initial presentation of a disease through recovery, disability or death. What he has concluded is that many diseases are either directly caused by toxins or may result from medications and procedures performed to treat toxin exposure. He believes that by simply removing toxins from our daily lives, we can dramatically improve and restore our health.

In this program he will teach us how and why toxicity in our homes is silently making many of us sick and what we can do about it. Dr. Brown will cover various categories of home toxicity including: essentials (air, food, and water); conveniences (processed foods, food preparation, household, and personal products); and energy sources and spirit (electromagnetic fields, light, and meditation). He will also present a framework of organic consciousness including steps to eliminate environmental toxins from our homes and to harness the power of mindfulness thereby providing an environmental sanctuary for optimal health.

This program is offered in cooperation with the Murrysville Community Library and is open to the public. No advanced registration is required.

Bio for Speaker

This month's speaker, Rob Brown, MD, is a physician with a deep-rooted passion for wellness and spiritual exploration. Dr. Brown's formal medical education began at the University of Miami School of Medicine. He completed a residency training program in diagnostic radiology in Pittsburgh and his fellowship training at the University of California, San Diego in musculoskeletal radiology. As a diagnostic radiologist, Dr. Brown has worked both in private practice and academic centers, including NYU Medical Center and the Cleveland Clinic Foundation. He has written many journal articles in peer reviewed radiology publications, as well as several book chapters in the radiology literature. Through his years of experience, including surviving a diagnosis of cancer, he has seen the effect toxins in our homes and lives have on human health, and has learned how providing an environmental sanctuary is critical to good health. To share these findings, he has recently authored the book Toxic Home/Conscious Home: A Mindful Approach to Wellness at Home.
