

If you will not be in your municipality on Election day, or cannot go to the polls due to illness or physical disability, you may get an application for an absentee ballot at the County website at:

Applying for an absentee ballot is a sensible backup plan in case of an unexpected event. There is no penalty for applying, but not using, an absentee ballot.

AAUW Candidate Night

Murrysville Area AAUW is once again hosting a Candidates Night on Friday evening May 10, from 7:00 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. in the Murrysville Council meeting room. The meeting will be televised on Cable Channel 19, and will be repeated several times before the Primary Election on Tuesday, May 21.

Candidates for the positions of Mayor of Murrysville, Murrysville Council and Franklin Regional School Director have been invited. While several of the offices are not contested, we still feel that it is in the best interest of the public to become familiar with the positions of the candidates as they answer questions regarding the offices they seek.

For the local offices, the Primary Election is frequently more highly contested than the General Election. Being informed is critical to using your vote wisely to select the best candidates.

Lane Neff has graciously accepted the role of moderator again, and Graeme Eldridge has agreed to be timekeeper. We will need several greeters who will meet the candidates and assist them in securing their seating by lottery, as well as give them their name cards and name tags.
