- If you are willing to let the library volunteers load boxes of leftover books after the sale into your car in order to take them to Half Price Books, please contact Annie S. Rivers. At your convenience in the following week, please plan to take the boxes to HPB and collect the money. Annie will come to you for the funds.
- Best of all, plan to shop the Sale and refill your book shelves. It's all for a good cause!

Proceeds from the Used Book Sale benefit the Murrysville Community Library as well as Murrysville AAUW. These proceeds allow us to help fund our educational and informative AAUW programs.

#### **Reading for Pleasure**


Reading for Pleasure will meet on December 1st at 1:00 PM for our November/December

### Congratulations to Annie S. Rivers, our 2022 ARCS Light Recipient



Annie S. Rivers joined the ARCS
Pittsburgh Chapter in 2008 and

becoming the Chair of
Membership. Annie is currently

serving as Secretary of the Board.

Annie is thrilled to support Scholars at CMU and Pitt. She understands the life-changing opportunities that grants and awards can give a person. As a student at LSU, she was chosen for a State Department-sponsored summer study program in Yugoslavia in 1965. Then for her junior year, she received a Junior Year Program (JYP) Grant to the East-West Center in Hawaii to study Chinese. The EWC, or the Center for Cultural and Technical Interchange Between East and West, is an education and research organization established by the U.S. Congress in 1960 to strengthen relations and understanding among the peoples and nations of Asia, the Pacific, and the United States.

Her special Junior Year Program culminated in a summer study in Taiwan and travel to Hong Kong, South Korea, and Japan. This experience sparked an interest in getting a Masters degree in Teaching English as a Second Language (MATESL). After graduating from LSU, Annie again applied to and received a Grant to the East-West Center for her graduate studies.

As a part of their EWC Grants, Annie and her husband Dick had the opportunity to complete an Overseas Career Internship in Bangkok, Thailand, where Dick worked at the American Embassy and Annie developed ESL materials at Chulalongkorn University and Thammasat University.
