Primary Election Information

It's Primary Election time, and the following deadlines should be noted:

May 1 – last day to register before the Primary, by 5 PM. Postmarks do not apply.

May 9 – last day to apply for mail-in or civilian absentee ballot, by 5 PM.

May 16 – Municipal Primary Election. Polls open 7 PM to 8 PM. Mail-in ballots must be received by the County by 8 PM, May 16.

Those who used mail-in ballots in the last election must reaffirm their plan to vote by mail this election. If you have not heard from the County Board of Elections to affirm that you are an eligible mail-in voter, go to vote.pa.gov to the section on "mail-in ballots" which will direct you to "check your mail-in voter status".

Donna Beard, editor of our newsletter, was instrumental in maintaining Branch communication and cohesion during the pandemic by publishing


an informative and attractive newsletter every month, even when meetings were suspended!

After teaching math courses from seventh grade math through AP Calculus, she moved to instructing varied college math courses at CCAC Boyce and Pitt. She concluded her 24 year Pitt career in the School of Education conducting methods courses and supervising student teachers and interns. She thoroughly enjoyed helping students at many levels achieve their full potential.

Retiring in 2012, Donna quickly resumed her community involvement. Rejoining AAUW, she was quickly recruited to join the Board as Secretary. When the Focus newsletter editor moved out of the area in early 2014, she assumed that position and has been a mainstay as editor for the past nine years.

Donna served as Treasurer for the Franklin Regional Adult School until it was dissolved in 2020. Donna also joined the Murrysville Trail Alliance (MTA) as a Board member. MTA strove to promote trails in Murrysville and help raise funds for the Westmoreland Heritage Trail through Murrysville.

Donna is an avid traveler who has overcome many physical challenges to recently hike in New Zealand. She inspires all of us with her courage and resilience!
