Hosting both Board and Branch AAUW meetings and providing the venue for our annual Used Book Sale, the Murrysville



Community Library celebrated 100 years of service to our community last year. We are honored to collaborate with the library in this service and to

support the library with the proceeds from our Used Book Sales.

The statistics tell much of the story of this service! Did you know that last year there were:

- 128,690 items circulated by the MCL? (Including books, e-books, magazines, audio books, music CDs, and DVDs
- 56,284 visits to the library
- 5,903 library cards holders
- 7,186 attendees at library programs
- 1,428 patrons accessing public computers
- 1,670 volunteer hours contributed
- 3,062 free wi-fi sessions
- 766 new library cards issued



This month from November 9<sup>th</sup> through the 11<sup>th</sup>, AAUW members will gather in the library to welcome members of the community to the

autumn Used Book Sale. While Carol Gezon describes this gathering as the "social event of the season," there is also serious work to be done.
